



Fellowship Guidelines:

(1) The FOT Fellowships are offered to medical students who are interested in a research year in the field of orthopaedic trauma. The fellow is to submit a one page proposal of their research goal for the upcoming year. This proposal is to be signed by both the fellow and mentor, and should include a second page with a timeline clearly describing expected accomplishments at quarterly intervals. This report is due May 1, 2007 for fellowships beginning July 1, 2007.

(2) An interim research progress report will be due by the accepted fellow by January 31, 2007. This report should include an introduction (1-2 pages), methods (1-3 pages), and results to date sections.

(3) A final program report will be due on June 1, 2008. The report will include: (a) Title and final abstract for all clinical research projects with which the fellow was involved; (b) Formal courses the fellow attended, including the final grade and any other didactic training programs in which the fellow participated; (c) Scientific meetings and conferences the fellow attended and expects to attend, including the names, dates and locations of the meetings; (d) Presentations the fellow made at scientific meetings, departmental meetings, professional societies, etc.; (e) Abstract and full-paper publications by the fellow, including the journal name and press dates; (f) Honors and awards the fellow received; and (g) Other relevant academic/scientific activities in which the fellow was involved.

Post-Fellowship Year:

Fellows are encouraged, if possible and if necessary to continue their research projects in some form during the year following the fellowship to bring it to all necessary completion.
